Adjuah appears to have suffered greater strife than most postal towns. During the early to mid 1890's their year marker became defective. On August 21st 1892 the "2" of "92" managed to become inverted:



However it was in 1894 that the problems really started. Here we see that on July 20th and September 10th the "4" had to be inserted in manuscript.





On September 20th both "9" and "4" were manuscript.



On April 5th 1895 the year marker was printing, but not in the correct position.



Later in the year on August 28th the whole year is again in manuscript. And in May 1896 the same handwriting is putting in service.
