



MALBON – Originally named Middle Branch, then Malbon in 1910, the Post Office has closed and opened several times, closing finally in 1975.



SELWYN – One of the more remote outposts in North Western Qld., opened in 1909 up on the Selwyn Range.

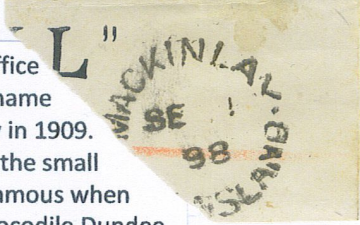


FRIEZLAND – The Post Office opened in 1899 and was located at Hampden, 42 miles south of Cloncurry. The name changed because there was already a Hampden in Qld., then changed again in 1916 to..... KURIDALA.

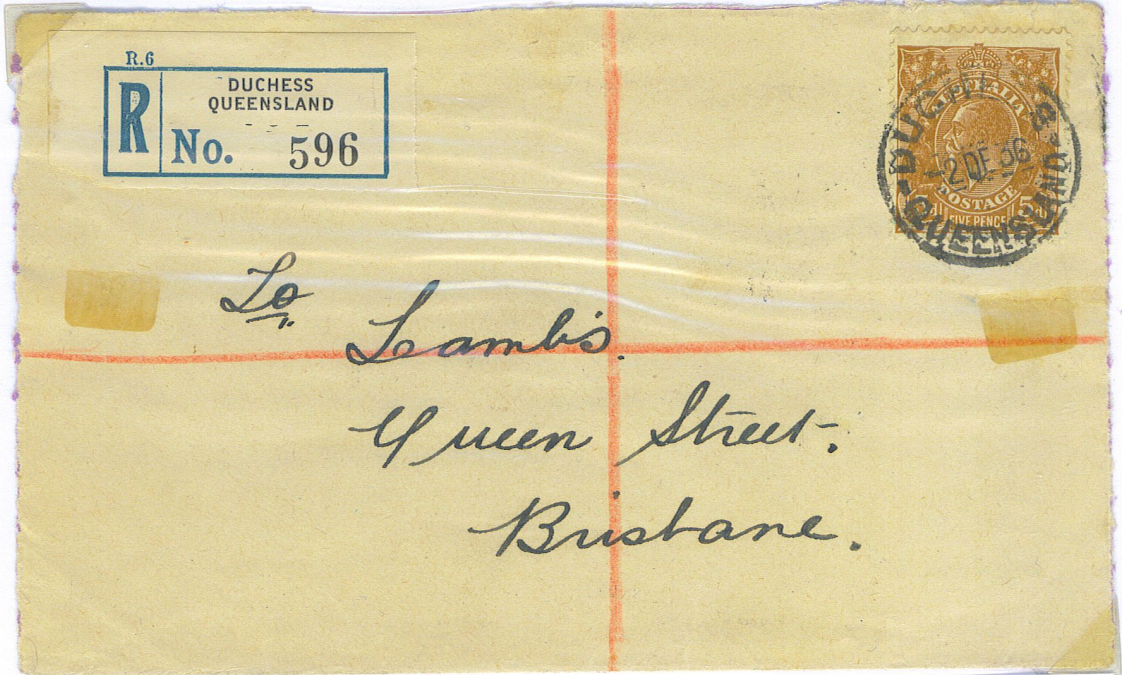


DAJARRA – As we head south of the main mining districts, we come to Dajarra, where the Post Office opened in 1919.

MACKINLAY – Post Office opened in 1895, the name Changing to McKinlay in 1909. In more recent times the small settlement became famous when its pub featured in Crocodile Dundee.



NORANSIDE – A station 51 miles south-west of Selwyn. It was only open as a Post Office from 1940 to 1949, although unofficial later, as indicated on this item.



DUCHESS – A copper mining town 32 miles north-east of Dajarra, originally named Duchess Mine.



BOULIA – On the convergence of roads from north, south and east, the Post Office opened in July 1879 and today the town is still a major junction.

MIDDLETON – Half way between Boulia in the west and Winton to the east, Middleton P.O. was opened in 1916 and closed in 1968 when fire destroyed the building.



URANDANGIE – The meeting point for mails from Camooweal, Cloncurry and Boulia, Urandangie was established in 1890, becoming official in 1893.
